


HOW TO DRAW A PANDA




Can you draw circles and ovals? You can use those shapes to draw a happy panda face!

Materials Needed: White paper, a pencil (such as the SumoGrip® Mechanical Pencil in 0.5mm or 0.7mm)
Optional Materials: Inking pens (such as Pigma Sensei® 0.6mm for thin lines, Pigma Sensei 1.0mm for coloring in black areas), Eraser


1 First, we'll lay down the foundation of your panda's face. With your pencil, draw an oval.




2 Next are the panda's ears! In the top left area of the oval, draw a half circle.




3 Draw another half circle on the top right area. You've just completed two panda ears.




4 At about the center left area, draw an oval at a slant.




5 In the opposite righthand area, draw a second oval at a slant. Now your panda has eye masks!




6 Next we'll add eyes. Draw a circle touching the inner edge of the left eye mask.



7 Now draw a circle touching the inner edge of the right eye mask.



8 For your panda's nose, draw a small oval in the center, just beneath the eyes.



9 Shade in the ears, eye masks, and nose. Complete your panda by drawing a smile!



CUSTOMIZE YOUR PANDA



Now that you know the basics of drawing a panda face, you can add your own personal touches!



Inking

To ink your panda, take the thinner pen (such as the Pigma Sensei 0.4mm tip) and trace over your pencil drawing. With the bolder inking pen (such as the Pigma Sensei 1.0mm tip), color in the black areas of the panda. Wait a few minutes for the ink to dry, then carefully erase away the pencil lines.

Now your panda really stands out!
